Appropriate attire for General Sessions, Workshops, and STAR Recognition Sessions

- Females
- Males
- Advisers, Chaperones, Guests
 - Red, black, or white polo or oxford shirt (long or short sleeves)
 - Black dress slacks or khaki pants (no capris or shorts)
 - Black or khaki skirts – no shorter than 2 inches above the knee
 - Dress shoes or sandals
 - Jeans, t-shirts, athletic wear are NOT included

***EXCEPTION:** Culinary Arts participants are welcome to wear their Chef's Attire during the STAR Events Recognition Sessions.*

Appropriate attire for STAR Events Participants / Idaho Events Participants

Follow event specifications for dress, and wear appropriate clothing for the nature of the presentation

Unacceptable Attire at FCCLA sessions

- Skin-tight or revealing clothing
- Midriff-baring clothing
- Extremely short skirts (shorter than 2 inches above the knee)
- Clothing with printing that is suggestive, obscene or promotes illegal substances
- Athletic clothing
- Swimwear
- Rubber, beach type flip flops
- Night wear (pajamas) should not be worn outside of your hotel room
