

Course Title	Course Description	Day & Length	Prerequisites and/or Required Equipment
Firefighter I Essentials of Firefighting	The Essentials class will be broken into four 4-hour blocks. Students will be divided into four groups and rotate through the four blocks of training.	Saturday and Sunday 16 Hours	Full Protective Clothing; to include Turnout Coat, Pants, Hood, Helmet, Boots, Gloves, Eve protection and SCBA are required for this class.
Forcible Entry	Identifies forcible entry tools and explains how to use and maintain them. Shows how to do "through-the-lock" entry on different types of doors. Demonstrates various methods of forced entry through three types of doors and three types of windows.	4 Hours	Required Equipment: Full Protective Clothing; to include Turnout Coat, Pants, Hood, Helmet, Boots, Gloves, Eye protection and certified SCBA. Prerequisite: None
Ventilation	Students will learn the basics of ventilation operations, the advantages of proper ventilation, and considerations for deciding if and where to ventilate. Also vertical and horizontal ventilation, natural and forced ventilation procedures.	4 Hours	Required Equipment: Full Protective Clothing; to include Turnout Coat, Pants, Hood, Helmet, Boots, Gloves, Eye protection and certified SCBA. Prerequisite: None
SCBA/PPE SCBA Confidence Maze	Presents the identification and function of protective clothing used in fire ground operations. Demonstrates correct methods for using and caring for protective clothing as well as the limits of protection. Presents the components, functions, and safety features of various types of SCBA. Demonstrates correct procedures for donning and doffing SCBA and shows how to change cylinders at an emergency scene.	4 Hours	Required Equipment: Full Protective Clothing; to include Turnout Coat, Pants, Hood, Helmet, Boots, Gloves, Eye protection and certified SCBA. Prerequisite: None
Ropes and Knots	Students will learn different types of ropes and their usage, along with rope construction and materials. The proper care, inspection record keeping, and storage of fire service ropes are also discussed. Several types of knots used in the fire service will be described as well. Also, methods for hoisting tools and equipment are reviewed	4 Hours	Required Equipment: None Prerequisite: None

Mixed Trainings	Students will be divided into groups and rotate through the blocks of training.	Saturday or Sunday 16 Hours	These classes are paired for optimal training. Pairs are color coded for each block of training.
Mixed Training #1 Flashover Safety and Survival Training This course will be utilizing SIFA's flashover trailer.	This is a lifesaving program for recognition and survival of the phenomena of flashover. Students will learn to better understand the phenomena of flashover, to recognize the signs of flashover, techniques to possibly give them time to escape a flashover and to save firefighters from injury and death from flashover.	Saturday or Sunday 8 Hours	To participate in this training, students must meet facial hair requirements as per NFPA. Required Equipment: Full Protective Clothing; to include Turnout Coat, Pants, Hood, Helmet, Boots, Gloves, Eye protection and certified SCBA. Prerequisite: Chief or Training Officer approval that student has completed Essentials of Firefighting training topics as required by NFPA 1403 to participate in live fire training.
Art of Reading Smoke	Often, smoke exuding from a building is the only clue available to predict fire behavior and the likelihood of a flashover or rapid fire spread. First arriving officers, Incident Commanders, and Safety Officers MUST know how to rapidly read smoke – this class explains the reading-smoke process and gives participants live scenarios using the Palmers dollhouse in a live burn situation.	Saturday or Sunday 8 Hours	Required Equipment: Full Protective Clothing; to include Turnout Coat, Pants, Hood, Helmet, Boots, Gloves and Eye Protection Prerequisite: None
Mixed Training #2 Electrical Vehicle Safety for Emergency Responders	The purpose of this course is to introduce this technology to emergency responders so they are able to perform their operations safely and effectively in the event of an electric vehicle emergency.	Saturday or Sunday 8 Hours	Required Equipment: None Prerequisite: None
Powerline Safety	Students will learn about electrical safety around structures and high voltage power lines.	Saturday or Sunday 8 Hours	Required Equipment: None Prerequisite: None
Mixed Training #3 NFIRS Reporting	This 6 hour segment consists of learning the National Fire Institute Reporting System. It is sponsored and taught by the Idaho State Fire Marshal's office. Students are encouraged to bring a lap top and fire reports to enter into the system during the class.	Saturday or Sunday	Required Equipment: None Prerequisite: None
Fire Service Instructor/Evaluator Training	FST will be conducting an Instructor/Evaluator/Proctor training class. Due to the many changes occurring within FST, all current instructors will need this class in the next few months. It is also open to people interested in becoming an In-House or State Instructor. The class will cover the roles and responsibilities, and paperwork process for serving as an Evaluator for skills tests and Proctor for written tests. It will also cover the process for requesting a class, roles and responsibilities, and paperwork process for serving as an Instructor.	Saturday or Sunday	Required Equipment: None Prerequisite: None

Extrication Awareness and Operations	Classroom presentations cover vehicle extrication safety considerations, scene safety systems, vehicle stabilization. Also includes hands on field presentation and practice of vehicle stabilization, extrication techniques using a wide range of basic tools through power hydraulic extrication tools. This Class Will be Off-Site.	Friday (1800) Saturday and Sunday 20 Hours	Required Equipment: Full protective clothing including; boots, leather gloves, hardhat, and eye protection. Prerequisite: None
Advanced Extrication	This class involves the extrication from higher level, more advanced situations. Students will effectively learn how to deal with the challenges associated with multiple vehicles in more complex settings. This Class Will be Off-Site.	Saturday and Sunday 16 Hours	Required Equipment: Full protective clothing including; boots, leather gloves, hardhat, and eye protection. Prerequisite: Extrication Awareness and Operations Required
Fire Apparatus and Pump Maintenance	The students will gain an understanding of basic pump theory and will learn to recognize and understand the principles of accessories such as primers, ball valves, etc. They will also learn how to perform a running check of the truck/fire pump and be able to determine if there are any operating deficiencies needing attention and/or repairs	Saturday and Sunday 16 Hours	Required Equipment: Coveralls and Safety Glasses Prerequisite: None
EMS – Air St. Luke's	Air St. Luke's will be teaching content on how to provide the best care for your patient, while still taking the best care of yourself, the EMS Provider. 16 CEU's will be earned.	Saturday and Sunday 16 Hours	Required Equipment: None Prerequisite: Licensed Emergency Medical Provider
Rope Rescue By CMC	Rope rescue is a subset of technical rescue that involves the use of ropes, anchors and belaying devices, friction rappel devices, various devices to utilize mechanical advantage for hauling systems, and other specialized equipment to reach victims and safely recover them.	Friday (1800) Saturday and Sunday 20 Hours	Prerequisite: None Required Equipment: Gloves, hardhat, eye protection, boots and coveralls.
Tactics for Idaho Firefighters	Skills and tactics for structural firefighting covering water supply, building construction, fire flows, water applications and firefighting for smaller departments.	Saturday and Sunday 16 Hours	Required Equipment: None Prerequisite: None
Haz-Mat Operations	Identify a haz-mat incident or the potential for a haz-mat incident; identify the product with the use of the ERG and placarding system and who to call for additional assistance in accordance with state and local response plans. Be involved and assist with the mitigation of a haz-mat incident.	Friday (1800) Saturday and Sunday 20 Hours	Required Equipment: None Prerequisite: None
NFA – Strategies & Tactics for Initial Company Operations	This course is designed and sponsored by the National Fire Academy for the company officer, acting officer or senior firefighter that strives to become an officer in the future. Course covers the operations necessary to successfully manage a fire scene.	Saturday and Sunday 16 Hours	Required Equipment: None Prerequisite: None

Fire Inspection 101 BLM G-131	During this course, you gain the skills and knowledge to conduct basic fire inspections and perform fire alarm/fire sprinkler system acceptance testing. You will identify fire and life safety hazards and correctly apply fire code provisions to address the hazard(s) based on the International Fire Code. Students are encouraged to bring their copy of the 2018 editions of the International Fire Code and a highlighter. The code is also available with t Wi-Fi connection. This course is designed to provide wildland firefighting skills (Firefighter Type 1) to structural firefighters who meet NFPA 1001 for Structural Firefighter 2 or equivalency. It is not available as a pre-packaged course. Instructors are required to assemble the materials and teach to the learning objectives stated in the S-131 Course Materials section. Students must pass the final course exam to receive credit for the course. The standard for passing an NWCG course is a score of at least 70 percent.	Saturday and Sunday 16 Hours Saturday and Sunday 16 Hours	Required Equipment: IFC 2018 Fire Code book if available. Prerequisite: None Required Equipment: None Prerequisite: Structural firefighters who meet NFPA 1001 for Structural Firefighter Type 2 and are qualified as wildland Firefighter Type 2 (FFT2).
BLM G-231	This course is designed to provide wildland firefighting skills Engine Boss, Single Resource, to structural firefighter drivers, operators, engineers, or company officers who meet NFPA 1021 for Fire Officer 1 or equivalency. It is not available as a pre-packaged course. Instructors are required to assemble the Materials Required for Course Presentation below and teach according to the Course Outline. In order to receive credit for passing the course, students are required to pass the final exams contained in the S-230 course materials and the S-290.	Saturday and Sunday 16 Hours	Required Equipment: None Prerequisite: Structural firefighter drivers, operators, engineers or company officers who meet NFPA 1021 for Fire Officer 1, are qualified as wildland Firefighter Type 1 (FFT1), and who have taken G-131.


