Note: Medical equipment can be very expensive. Costs can be reduced by partnering with a local health agency (donations), rotating students through stations, so fewer items are required for the group, or partnering with another training program.

NON-DISPOSABLE ITEMS

Accessible sink with soap, paper towel dispenser, and garbage can*
Analog clock with a second hand*
BP cuff*
Bath blanket*
Blood glucose meter (add a row for lancet, test strips, sharps container, and approved disinfecting)
Commode*
CPR equipment, if training occurs onsite
Dirty linen disposal bag or basket*
Draw or turn sheet
Electric razor
Fitted sheet*
Gait belt*
Hand towels
Hospital bed (In good repair with bed/head/feet raising capacity and side rails) *
Hospital gown
IV gown
Manikin (with male and female perineum) *
Mechanical lift
Medical grade blanket or bedspread (without rounded corners to facilitate learning mitered corners)
Medical grade electronic thermometer and probe covers
Medical grade scale
Mock dietary card*
Nail clippers (student may bring from home)
Pillowcases*
Pillows (a variety of flat and thick) *
Pulse oximeter
Serving tray
Something to imitate a call light*
Stethoscope*
Teaching stethoscope*
Ten-pound box*

Warm and cold applications (disposable or non-disposable available)

Wheelchair or chair with wheelchair cushion (wheelchair in good repair with removable legs) *

NON-DISPOSABLE ONLY IN TRAINING (assigned to each resident in agency)

Anti-embolic stockings (thigh high, preferably open-toed) *

Appropriate clothing (ambulating required, but student clothing is sufficient if stated) *

Bedpan (fracture)

Bedpan (regular)

Catheter drainage bag*

Catheter bag cover

Clothes for manikin*

Dentures (upper, lower, and/or partial plate) *
